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Total Solar Eclipse: Totally Awesome!

Thousands of people from across the United States are expected to flock to the Northeast next week for the total solar eclipse. According to NASA, the eclipse will begin at approximately 2:11 pm and our area will offer some of the best viewing - lasting only a brief three minutes and 28 seconds in each viewing area. Exciting stuff!

The next total solar eclipse is not expected until 2045 and scientists say the next viewing will be available to even fewer US states. The last total solar eclipse was reported on December 4, 2021, but it was only visible in Antarctica, South Africa and parts of the Southern Atlantic Ocean. According to <u>Almanac.com</u>, the last total solar eclipse viewable in the US was August 21, 2017 and prior to that citing, none had been visible since 1778!

While we may have caught glimpses of an eclipse in the past, during a total solar eclipse the moon completely blocks the sun as it passes perfectly between the sun and the earth.

Total solar eclipses happen about every three years of so, but are only completely visible in specific areas. <u>Almanac.com</u> says the US can expect another appearance on August 12, 2045. The website offers a "Total Solar Eclipse Guide" for more information.

Malware: What is it? Avoiding it.

This is the second article in a series of staying safe online.

Malware is a broad term to describe any software of code designed to harm your computer or network. Malware can completely disable your computer or simply cause your computer to behave a little glitchy. Malware can infect your computer without you even knowing it's there.

Different types of malware include:

Viruses - Malware that is designed to replicate itself, taking up space on your computer, causing it to crash

Trojans - Pretend to be legitimate files and then allow access to your system to others

Spyware - Allows others to track the sites you visit on your computer

- Adware Clutters your desktop with pop-up ads and redirects your browser search
- Ransomware Locks your computer system unless you agree to pay a "ransom" to release it

How do we avoid Malware? Here are a few tips. Don't open email attachments from people you don't know, don't download files from untrustworthy sources, and always have good antivirus software install and updated on your computer.

Removing Malware can be a difficult process and can do harm to your device. The best defense against Malware is being vigilant. Check to make sure that the sites you visit are secure and trustworthy before clicking that link or download. Looks for sites that have a padlock icon on your user's address bar to ensure that the site is secure. Stay vigilant, stay safe online!

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
